Any student who completely withdraws from the University and is a recipient of Federal Title IV Financial Aid is subject to the following policy regarding refund and repayment of those funds (34 CFR 668.22). This policy will apply to students who discontinue enrollment in descepto or after the first day of the term. John Carroll must include in the R2T4 calculation all funds of Title IV aid that were disbursed or could have been disbursed.

Title IV aid, as defined by the Higher Education Act of 1965, includes the following programs:

calculation This policy does not apply to students who cancel their registration prior to the first day of classes or to students who drop some but not all of their classes. However, students should notify the Office of Student Enrollment and Financial Services (SEFS) of any changes made to their schedule to ensure eligibility of aid is not affected.
